Selected parcels highlighted in blue are the ~40 properties being considered for addition to the Historic Resources Inventory.





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Road segments, such as Serpentine Place were suggested for consideration by participants at the September 2013 open house because of their significance in the original layout of transportation in Shoreline or for their use by residents for neighborhood pasttimes. Community members have inquired periodically over the last six (or more) years, whether the Crest Theatre could be nominated for landmark designation. No application has been made to date.

This building is historically interesting due to its community significance rather than its architecture, which is altered.
