CHINESE-INSPIRED COMMUNITY ART PROJECT “PACIFYING THE DRAGON” BRINGS DANCE TROUPE, ARTISTS TO HAMLIN PARK

Shoreline, WA – Inspired by Hakka Chinese traditions from New Territories, Hong Kong, the Shoreline Public Art Program will host a community arts event **from noon - 2:00pm on Saturday, December 3 at Hamlin Park**, featuring a performance by Nightingale Dance Troupe. The project received financial support through a grant from 4culture.

To ensure good harvests in the future, and to cleanse the land after recent events, the Dragon must be ‘pacified.’ In addition to the dance performance offering an interpretation, a commissioned ceramic jar by Jacob Foran will be also buried along with joss paper burning.
