Location: Paramount Open Space Park, Shoreline. Use the park entrance at [11th Ave NE and NE 152nd St](#). Follow the trail for a short distance into the park and the sculpture will be on the right. It will be on display until spring 2017.

This sculpture has been created out of invasive ivy collected from the site over the summer and fall by a small group of volunteers, preserving a small patch of habitat on the site, particularly the grove of trees from which the piece is hanging. It was inspired by the story of Paramount Park, which has been preserved and restored through decades of stewardship and effort by the surrounding neighbors and volunteers.
