



## What You Can Do to Keep Water Clean

A storm drain is the entrance to a system that collects and carries water from streets and parking lots, and discharges it **untreated** into our lakes, streams, wetlands and Puget Sound.



### Storm Drain Stenciling

Spread the word by stenciling storm drains with the message “Dump No Waste, Drains to Stream.” The City of Shoreline has kits and instructions for loan to community groups. Contact the Environmental Programs Assistant at (206) 801-2455 to participate in the stenciling program and help keep our water clean.

## When You Wash a Car on Pavement Where Does Soapy Water Go?

Water that is rinsed off a car contains a mixture of detergents, oils and heavy metals that flow onto the street, travel into a storm drain and then flow into Shoreline's streams or straight into Puget Sound. This soapy, polluted water is untreated and can kill aquatic plants and wildlife.



## What Can You Do To Keep Our Water Clean?

The City of Shoreline offers a SudSafe Car Wash Kit on-loan to community groups, churches and schools to encourage environmentally-friendly car wash events. For car wash coupon fundraising opportunities please see the *Charity Car Wash Coupons* section.

## SudSafe Car Wash Kit


Each kit contains a car wash announcement board, hose and a basin to capture and divert the soapy water away from the storm drain and onto grass, gravel or into a sink that drains to the wastewater treatment system.



## Site Requirements

To use the SudSafe Car Wash Kit, the following is required at the site:

- Electrical power within 100 feet of the wash area
- Grass or gravel area, or sink or toilet that lead to the sewer system within 100 feet of the wash area.

## Eco-Friendly Car Wash Tips

- Look for soaps that are:
  - \* Non-toxic
  - \* Biodegradable
  - \* Phosphate-free
  - \* Vegetable- or citrus-based
- Phosphates can cause excess algae to grow, and as algae decays, the process uses up oxygen in the water that fish need.
- Use a hose with an adjustable nozzle.
- After washing, dispose of bucket contents into the sewer system such as toilets and sinks.
- 'Biodegradable' only means that the soap will break down over time. It is preferable to use a biodegradable soap, but it doesn't necessarily guarantee it is better for plants, animals and the environment.
