

WHAT IS THE HOME COLLECTION SERVICE?

The Home Collection Service helps eligible King County seniors and residents with disabilities safely dispose of hazardous waste they may have in their homes.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I HAVE ANY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

A product is hazardous if the label says: **Caution, Warning, Danger** or **Poison**.

Household hazardous waste is any waste left over from **pesticides, oil-based paints, solvents, batteries, thinners, motor oil, antifreeze, and household cleaners**.

These products can harm people, pets, and the environment. Hazardous wastes should never be thrown in the trash, dumped on the ground, poured down a storm drain or burned.

WHERE CAN I SAFELY DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE?

If you **are eligible** for this program, you can have your household hazardous waste picked up at your home.

If you **are not eligible**, but live in King County, you can dispose of household hazardous waste at any household hazardous waste collection facilities or events. Disposal options are listed on the back. Call ahead to check holiday schedules.

There is no fee for household hazardous waste disposal. It is paid for in your utility bills.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To find out if you are eligible, call the **Household Hazards Line** at **206-296-4692** or **1-888-869-4233**, Monday – Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (except holidays).

When you call for home collection of your hazardous waste, you will be asked several questions to determine your eligibility. The program has a limited budget to help those who have no means of disposing of household hazardous waste at collection sites.

Questions include:

Are you over the age of 65 or are you a person with disabilities?

Are you able to drive to the local household hazardous waste collection facilities or collection events?

Is there anyone who can drive you and your hazardous waste to the household hazardous waste collection facilities or events?

IF YOU MEET THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

You will be asked your name, address and telephone number. You will also be asked about the types and amounts of waste you have for collection.

A collection date will be scheduled, usually Wednesday between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. You will be asked to sign a certificate verifying your eligibility at the time of collection.
