



## SEPA THRESHOLD DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

### PROJECT INFORMATION

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL: **Shoreline City Council has authorized the filing of a Notice of Intent to assume of that portion of the Ronald Wastewater District located within Snohomish County. The Notice of Intent is to be filed with the Snohomish County Boundary Review Board. The assumption process is defined by RCW 35.13.A.030 and includes the assumption of all assets and liabilities held by the District on the date of assumption and transfer of its entire sanitary sewer service area within the unincorporated area of Snohomish County as shown on the Existing Sewer System District Map dated 2014. The date of transfer to the City will be October 21, 2017 and will include transition steps included in the 2002 Operating Agreement with Ronald Wastewater District.**

The City of Shoreline has determined that the proposal will not have a probable significant adverse impact(s) on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c).
