

ORDINANCE NO. 580

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, REDUCING THE PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURAL SERVICES BOARD TO NINE MEMBERS INCLUDING TWO NONVOTING YOUTH MEMBERS BEGINNING APRIL 1, 2011; AND AMENDING SHORELINE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 2.55.020

WHEREAS, most cities in our region have advisory boards of seven members to promote more participation in discussions; and

WHEREAS, Shoreline's Planning Commission has recently been reduced from nine to seven members to promote the effectiveness and efficiency; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amendment. Section 2.55.020 of the Shoreline Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

2.55.020 Membership.


The board shall consist of ~~11~~9 members. Only persons who reside, own property or are employed in the city of Shoreline shall be eligible for membership on the parks, recreation and cultural services board. Two members shall be between the ages of 15 and 19 at the beginning of their term in addition to meeting other eligibility requirements and shall be non-voting members. Members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses pursuant to city ordinances and policies. The position of a member shall become vacant upon such member's ceasing to reside within, own property within, or be employed within the Shoreline city limits. The position of a member shall be forfeited and become vacant for failure to attend three regular consecutive meetings of the board, unless such absence is excused by a majority of the board. Vacancies occurring other than through the expiration of terms shall be filled for the unexpired terms in the same manner as for appointments as provided in this chapter.

Members shall serve four-year terms; provided however, that youths appointed to the two age-restricted positions shall serve two-year terms. No member shall serve more than three consecutive four-year terms, and youth members shall be limited to two consecutive two-year terms. Terms shall expire the thirty-first day of March.


Section 2. Publication, Effective Date. A summary of this ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the official newspaper. The ordinance shall take effect and be in full force April 1, 2011.
