**RESOLUTION NO. 296**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING COUNCIL RULES OF PROCEDURE TO MAKE SILENCE AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE; AND AMENDING RULE 7.16.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council at its meeting of February 8, 2010 reviewed Council rules and procedures, including the presumption given to silence of a Councilmember on a Council vote;

**WHEREAS**, the Council finds that counting silence as an affirmative vote, while preserving the right to abstain, will allow expedited proceedings by allowing the Mayor to find consensus without a formal vote on routine actions; and

**WHEREAS**, amending rule 7.16 to count silence as an affirmative vote is consistent with Roberts Rules of Order; now therefore

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES:**

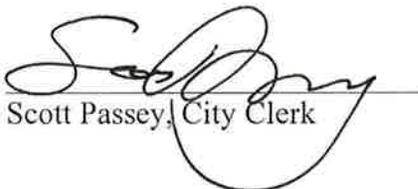
That the Shoreline City Council Rules of Procedure Rule 7.16 is hereby amended as follows:

7.16 If a member of the Council ~~abstains or is silent~~ on a vote, it shall be recorded as an neutral affirmative vote. If a member of the Council abstains, it shall be recorded as an abstention and not included in the vote tally.
