ORDINANCE NO. 160

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 146, AS AMENDED, BY INCREASING THE APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FOR WASTE RECYCLING PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the 1998 Budget was adopted in Ordinance No. 146; and amended by subsequent ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City finds it of significant value to provide opportunities to educate citizens and business about the importance of recycling and to provide waste recycling events to dispose of materials that are not allowed for curbside collection; and

WHEREAS, the City received notification of the award of additional available grant funds to provide two waste reduction and recycling events in 1998 after the 1998 budget had already been developed; and

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline is required by RCW 35A.33.075 to include all revenues and expenditures for each fund in the adopted budget; NOW, THEREFORE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 146. The City hereby amends Section 3. Of Ordinance No. 146, the 1998 Annual Budget, by increasing the appropriation from the General Fund to \$19,420,802 and by increasing the Total Funds appropriation to \$44,951,538 as follows:



Section 2. Funds for Hazardous Waste Recycling Program. The City Manager is hereby authorized to expend an additional sum of \$17,694 in the Parks Department for the Hazardous Waste Recycling Program.

Section 3. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this ordinance be preempted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or preemption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 4. Effective Date. A summary of this ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the official newspaper of the City and shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the date of publication.
