ORDINANCE NO. 161

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 146, AS AMENDED, BY INCREASING THE APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FOR A WOOD AND YARD WASTE CHIPPING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the 1998 Budget was adopted in Ordinance No. 146; and amended by subsequent ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City finds it of significant value to provide opportunities for the community to convert tree and brush trimmings into compostable or otherwise usable products and to reduce the environmental and economic impacts associated with yard waste entering the waste stream; and

WHEREAS, the City, in 1997, received a grant from the State Department of Ecology for the purchase of a chipper and truck to establish a wood and yard waste chipping program; and

WHEREAS, the City applied for and received notification of award for an additional two grants, one from the State and one from King County, to purchase a tractor and construct a processing facility for chipped wood and yard waste material; and

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline is required by RCW 35A.33.075 to include all revenues and expenditures for each fund in the adopted budget; NOW, THEREFORE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 146. The City hereby amends Section 3. Of Ordinance No. 146, the 1998 Annual Budget, by increasing the appropriation from the General Fund by \$93,620 to \$19,514,422 and by increasing the Total Funds appropriation to \$45,045,158 as follows:



Section 2. Funds to Implement Wood and Yard Waste Chipping Program. The City Manager is hereby authorized to expend the sum of \$93,620 from the General Fund in the Parks Department to implement a Wood and Yard Waste Chipping Program.

Section 3. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this ordinance be preempted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or preemption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 4. Effective Date. A summary of this ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the official newspaper of the City and shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the date of publication.
