

**ORDINANCE NO. 989**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE COVERAGE PERIOD OF THE CITY'S COMMUTE TRIP REDUCTION PLAN AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 14.10.020 OF THE SHORELINE MUNICIPAL CODE TO REFLECT A DEFERRAL OF STATE MANDATED UPDATES UNTIL 2025.**

WHEREAS, RCW 70.94.527 requires the City of Shoreline to adopt a commute trip reduction plan ("CTR Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the CTR Plan must require affected employers to implement programs to reduce the number of single-occupant vehicles used for commuting purposes by their employees to help address air quality, energy consumption, and traffic congestion; and

WHEREAS, the City originally adopted its CTR Plan in August 2008 with the passage of Ordinance No. 516 and has amended the CTR Plan on four (4) occasions with the adoption of Ordinance Nos. 526, 658, 787, and 865, collectively, the Current CTR Plan; and

WHEREAS, with the adoption of Ordinance No. 865, the City utilized a Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Executive Board and Technical Committee (the "CTR Board") action exempting jurisdictions from local/regional plan updates for the 2019-2023 cycle, deferring updates, and extending the Current CTR Plan until June 2023; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, 2022, the TDM Technical Committee approved another deferral of CTR plans, deferring updates until June 2025 based on the continued transportation behavior changes, future trends in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and work the State is completing to reevaluate key program elements, performance measures, and reporting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a properly noticed public hearing on the deferral of updates to the Current CTR Plan on June 12, 2023; and

WHEREAS, an amendment is needed to reflect the deferral of updates to June 2025 as authorized by the Washington State TDM Technical Committee;

**NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Amendment to SMC 14.10.020.** SMC 14.10.020 City of Shoreline CTR Plan, dated August 25, 2008, as amended by Ordinance Nos. 516, 526, 658, 787, and 865 is amended to cover a 2023-2025 planning period.

**Section 2. Corrections by City Clerk or Code Reviser.** Upon approval of the City Attorney, the City Clerk and/or the Code Reviser are authorized to make necessary corrections to this Ordinance, including the corrections of scrivener or clerical errors; references to other local,

state, or federal laws, codes, rules, or regulations; or ordinance numbering and section/subsection numbering and references.

**Section 3. Severability.** Should any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance or its application to any person or situation be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to any person or situation.


**Section 4. Publication and Effective Date.** A summary of this Ordinance consisting of the title shall be published in the official newspaper. This Ordinance shall take effect five days after publication.


