Join our Food Waste Study

Collecting food scraps for composting is important, but it is not always easy—especially in apartments or rural areas. Seattle Public Utilities and King County are exploring whether food scrap devices can help. Participate in our study and try a clean, odor-free way to collect your food scraps while helping shape future programs.

What's involved?

- Take a brief survey to see if your household or property qualifies.
- Receive a free Mill device during the study (runs through October 2026).
- Easy setup via the Mill app. *All participants must have continual WiFi access.*
- Mail back Food Grounds (bit.ly/mill-pickups) when full. *Packaging and pickups provided free of charge.*
- Food scrap device usage data (such as pounds of food scraps added) will be anonymized and aggregated then shared with City and County to inform the study and **increase sustainability efforts to reduce household food waste.**
